Mrs Sullivan asked the Minister for Education and Training and Minister for the Arts (Mr Welford) —

QUESTION:

- (1) How has the new Prep Year been received in the primary schools in the Pumicestone Electorate?
- (2) How much has been spent on fully introducing the Prep Year into Pumicestone schools?

ANSWER:

(1) The implementation of the new Prep Year has gone smoothly in the Pumicestone electorate, with students settling in well. At day 8 there were 216 Prep enrolments, being taught by twelve Prep teachers across the six state schools in the Pumicestone Electorate, as follows:

For the implementation of Prep in 2007, almost \$500,000 has been distributed to state schools in the Pumicestone electorate for the improvement of Prep facilities, as follows.
