MR HAYWARD ASKED THE MINISTER FOR STATE DEVELOPMENT, EMPLOYMENT AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS (MR MICKEL)—

# **QUESTION:**

What funding has been provided under the Community Jobs Plan and other programs administered by his department to assist unemployed residents of the Kallangur Electorate during the past 12 months?

### ANSWER:

Under the *Breaking the Unemployment Cycle* initiative, the Queensland Government has been helping disadvantaged jobseekers to enter or return to the paid workforce since October 1998 and during 2006/07 this initiative will transition to the new *Skilling Queenslanders for Work* initiative.

Since October 1998 when the *Breaking the Unemployment Cycle* initiative was introduced and up to December 2006, \$8.102 million has been invested in the Kallangur Electorate. This funding has provided employment and training assistance for 1,707 people with 1,454 of those assisted getting a job. More specifically, \$2.173 million has been approved for 12 Community Jobs Plan projects providing work placements within the electorate.

The Get Set for Work – Caboolture project, run by the Caboolture Area Youth Service, was approved and completed in January of this year benefiting 15-17 year old youth from the Kallangur electorate. This project resulted in 66% of participants finding jobs and 39% undergoing training. The project's main objective was the re-entry of 44 early school leavers into mainstream education or entry into employment or vocational training.
