MRS STUCKEY asked the Minister for Education and Training and Minister for the Arts (Mr Welford) —

QUESTION:

With reference to the recent rollout of Prep throughout the education system and, in particular, the sun safety of these young children —

- (1) Why has the Government not ensured appropriate shade facilities for the new Prep classes at Elanora State School?
- (2) Why do State schools appear to be exempt from shade provisions when childcare centres are not?
- (3) What does he plan to do to rectify the situation?

ANSWER:

As usual, the assumption underlying this question is false. I am pleased to be able to advise the Member about what is happening at Elanora State School, although I am sure a conversation with any responsible officer at the school could have alerted her to the error of her claim about this matter.

- 1. Our Government initiated a major building program at Elanora State School in readiness for the introduction of Prep. As such, a new two classroom building was constructed at a cost of \$550,000. In addition, two existing classrooms were refurbished and there were minor improvements to the existing preschool classrooms.
 - The construction of the new building involved the demolition of the existing small sandpit. Subsequently, the school constructed a new sandpit approximately 50% larger than the original one. An order was placed for a shade cover for the new sandpit in February and the school is awaiting the contractor.
- 2. Childcare facilities are required to comply with the Child Care Act 2002. State education facilities guidelines provide for sheltered areas for all outdoor learning and shade over play structures.
- There are appropriate shade facilities at Elanora State School and I am not aware of anything that needs rectifying. The Honourable Member could avoid further embarrassing herself, if in future she bothers to check the facts before making false assertions.
