MR GIBSON asked the Minister for State Development, Employment and Industrial Relations (MR MICKEL) —

## QUESTION:

With reference to the article in *The Courier Mail* on Thursday, 25 January 2007 entitled, "Youth are leaving the land forever" –

- (1) What initiatives has the Government implemented to attract people to Queensland's agricultural workforce?
- (2) What initiatives has the Government implemented to fill the void of skilled workers caused by Queensland's mining boom?

## ANSWER:

I welcome the Member for Gympie's new found interest in the issue of unemployment.

Since Breaking the Unemployment Cycle began in October 1998 \$10.132 million has been invested in the Gympie electorate. This funding has assisted 1,736 people with 1,473 obtaining employment. Since 9<sup>th</sup> September 2006, grants administered by the Department of Employment and Industrial Relations have provided \$284,120 funding for 55 persons in the Gympie Electorate to receive employment and training assistance.
