MR SEENEY asked the Deputy Premier, Treasurer and Minister for Infrastructure (MS BLIGH) –

QUESTION:

With reference to recent media reports that the State Government will enlist private sector help to build infrastructure projects for South East Queensland —

- (1) How many Public Private Partnerships (PPPs) has the State Government entered into since the election of the Queensland Labor Government in 1998 (reported separately and broken down by (a) the private sector entities that the State Government contracted PPPs with for each year and (b) the dollar value contributed by both the State Government and the private sector entity, reported separately)?
- (2) What current guidelines or policies does the State Government have as a guiding principle to the types of projects that can be entered into through a PPP contract?

ANSWER:

- (1) (a) & (b) Details of Public Private Partnerships (PPPs) formally entered into or in the process of being evaluated are provided in the table below.
