MR JOHNSON ASKED THE MINISTER FOR TRANSPORT, TRADE, EMPLOYMENT AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS (MR MICKEL) —

QUESTION:

How many fatalities in Queensland over the last 12 months involved heavy transport vehicles and where did these accidents occur?

ANSWER:

I am advised during 1 July 2007 to 30 June 2008, there were 75 fatalities as a result of crashes involving heavy freight vehicles which represent 22.7% of the Queensland road toll for the same period.
