

Question on Notice

MS DARLING asked the Deputy Premier and Minister for Infrastructure and Planning (MR LUCAS) –

QUESTION:

With reference to the Information Day held in October by the Urban Land Development Authority for Fitzgibbon and neighbouring residents—
How will community feedback be incorporated into final plans for the Fitzgibbon development area?

ANSWER:

I thank the Honourable Member for Sandgate for her question.

I have been advised that the first Fitzgibbon Community Information Day was held on the 11 October 2008. At the event the Urban Land Development Authority (ULDA) supplied feedback forms to members of the community so they could provide detailed information for the development of the final plans for Fitzgibbon. The comments received by the ULDA were collated and reviewed as part of preparing the draft Structure Plan which was released on 15 November 2008. Any feedback received will continue to inform the preparation of the proposed Development Scheme.

The ULDA has advised me that it also receives ongoing community feedback via emails, letters and feedback forms from further community information days. All feedback is reviewed and, in combination with input from the newly established Community Reference Group will continue to inform the drafting of the proposed Development Scheme.

I understand that the formal submission period for the proposed Development Scheme for the Fitzgibbon UDA will run for 30 business days and is anticipated to begin in late January 2009. During this time the community may make written submissions about any part of the proposed Development Scheme and the ULDA must consider all submissions received during this submission period.
