MR POWELL ASKED THE MINISTER FOR COMMUNITY SERVICES AND HOUSING AND MINISTER FOR WOMEN (MS STRUTHERS)—

With reference to the increasing number of individuals and families who are resorting to sleeping in their vehicles in the Moreton Bay and Sunshine Coast regional council catchments—

Will the Minister provide a detailed list (including service description, capacity and contact details) of homelessness and emergency accommodation services and facilities in those catchments?

ANSWER:

The Department of Communities funds five non-government organisations to deliver specialist homelessness services within the Moreton Bay Regional Council boundaries. These services are presented in Table A.

Funding is also allocated by the department to 10 non-government organisations to deliver specialist homeless services within the Sunshine Coast Regional Council boundaries. These services are presented in Table B.

In addition, Homeless Persons Information Queensland provides telephone information, advice and referral service for people who are homeless and seeking information on relevant services. The statewide phone number is 1800 474 753.
