MR DICKSON ASKED THE MINISTER FOR TRANSPORT (MS NOLAN) —

QUESTION:

What motor vehicle registration charges were levied for the years 2004 to the present (broken down by year and category) and what registration charges are projected for the years 2010 to 2014?

ANSWER:

I thank the Member for Buderim for the question.

The current method of charging light vehicle registration fees in Queensland is based on a vehicle's number of cylinders or rotors. The main cylinder groupings are four, six and eight cylinders.

The motor vehicle registration charges that were levied for the years 2004 to 2009 are set out in the table below:

The increase in motor vehicle registration fees, which took effect from 1 July 2009, was announced on 9 December 2008 as part of the Major Economic Statement 2008-09.

The Compulsory Third Party insurance premiums are not shown in the above table. Compulsory Third Party is collected on behalf of the Motor Accident and Insurance Commission who set the premium levels. Future registration charges have not been determined and will be announced when finalised.
