## Asked on 7 October 2010

Mr Cripps asked the Minister for Education and Training (Mr Wilson) —

### QUESTION:

Will the Minister provide the staff turnover rates (by mode of employment – full time, part time, casual) for the state secondary schools in and servicing communities in my Electorate of Hinchinbrook for the years 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009 and to 30 June 2010, including the Northern Beaches State High School, Ingham State High School, Tully State High School and Innisfail State High School/Innisfail State College?

### ANSWER:

I thank the Member for his question.

I have been advised by the Department the staff turnover rates for permanent staff over the last four years and six months for the requested secondary schools is as follows –

Staff Turnover Rate (percentage) is based on total employees that have left the Department divided by the total numbers of employees at each school for the given year.
