## QUESTION:

Will the Minister inform the House about the 2011 enrolment figures for schools in the Morayfield Electorate?

## ANSWER:

I thank the Member for his question, and commend him for his continuing support of schools in his electorate of Morayfield.

Almost 8,000 primary and secondary students at the nine state schools in the Morayfield electorate are among the 489,000 students currently attending Queensland state schools who are benefiting from the Labor Government's education reforms. There are around 360 more students at the schools this year than at the same time in 2010.

The Bligh Government has a proud record when it comes to education. We want to give all students access to a world-class education, no matter where they live.
