# **Asked on 10 May 2011**

MS SIMPSON asked the Minister for Community Services and Housing and Minister for Women (MS STRUTHERS)—

### **QUESTION**

Will the Minister provide in table format for each region the number of (a) occupied government managed public housing properties, (b) vacant government-managed public housing properties and (c) people on the register for long-term housing?

## **ANSWER**

The Queensland Government owns and manages 55,055 social housing dwellings across the State. As at 30 April 2011, only 802 dwellings were vacant which equates to a vacancy rate of 1.5 per cent. This rate is far less than the private residential sector vacancy rate which in September 2010 was 4.4 per cent.

A large majority of the social housing vacancies occur as a result of tenants moving to other accommodation options. When a dwelling is vacated it must be inspected and maintenance work completed before the next tenant can occupy the dwelling. Maintenance can include disability and seniors modifications.
