MR WELLINGTON asked the Minister for Health (MR SPRINGBORG)-

QUESTION:

With reference to the Nambour General Hospital—

- (1) What health services have been reduced at the Nambour Hospital since the Hospital Board was created?
- (2) What health services have been increased at the Nambour Hospital since the Hospital Board was created?

ANSWER:

I thank the Honourable Member for Nicklin for his question.

I am advised that there have been no planned service reductions at Nambour Hospital since the creation of the Sunshine Coast Hospital and Health Board.

I am further advised that there has been a range of new services or expansion of existing services that has occurred since 1 July 2012. Most notable in this category is the expansion of Cardiac Services which so far this financial year has seen approximately 1000 cases treated at Nambour that would have previously required treatment in Brisbane.
