MR BYRNE asked the Minister for Police and Community Safety (MR DEMPSEY)—

QUESTION:

With reference to the Keelty Review mentioned in the 2013-14 State Budget, will the Minister provide details of all the meetings (listed by date, location, topic, meeting attendees and cost of travel including accommodation) that Mr Keelty has undertaken as part of his review of the future of the Queensland Police Service and all emergency services in Queensland?

ANSWER:

As the Member is aware, the Keelty Review was established by the Government in 2012 to lead an operational review into Queensland's emergency services including police, fire, rescue, ambulance services and corrective services.

The review is headed by the experienced former Commissioner of the Australian Federal Police, Mr Mick Keelty, and was established because no holistic review of Queensland's police and emergency services had occurred in over 20 years.

I have consulted with Mr Keelty who advises that he and his team have met with a wide range of organisations, unions, individuals, groups and stakeholders from right across Queensland.

These stakeholders have provided invaluable insight ensuring full understanding of the operational issues affecting police and emergency services in this state.

In the interests of transparency, I am happy to provide a list of Mr Keelty's meetings once the Keelty Report has been released.
