MR WELLINGTON asked the Minister for Health (MR SPRINGBORG)-

QUESTION:

With reference to public hospital board meetings—

Are minutes of the meetings freely available to the public and, if not, what review is there of the decisions made by a board?

ANSWER:

I thank the Honourable Member for Nicklin for his question.

Under Part 4 of the *Hospital and Health Boards Regulation 2012*, and subject to obligations relating to confidentiality and privacy, Hospital and Health Services (HHS) are required to publish a summary of key issues discussed and decisions made by Hospital and Health Boards following each board meeting.

Arrangements for the publication of the summaries are matters for local determination. I am advised this has been done to date by publishing summaries on HHS websites, or by sharing information via communiqués with key stakeholders.
