MR WELLINGTON asked the Premier (MR NEWMAN)—

With reference to the Sunshine Coast Regional Council that is investigating a proposal to relocate the Nambour cricket club from its current home on State Government land in Nambour to a new site—

Will the Premier investigate the council's proposal for the future use of this significant State Government site?

ANSWER:

The Nambour Cricket Club is currently located at the Nambour showgrounds on land owned by the State and managed by the Sunshine Coast Regional Council. The showgrounds are a Deed of Grant in Trust dedicated for show and sports ground purposes.

The council is responsible for maintaining and managing the land for show and sports ground purposes, and is currently undertaking a review of the use of the showgrounds.

As a result of the review, the council will prepare a master plan and a detailed land management plan for the showground's future use.

The Queensland Government supports the development of the master plan and land management plan for the showgrounds so that the council can plan for future use of the land for community use.

I understand that the council has advised the Department of Natural Resources and Mines that it has no desire to relocate the Nambour Cricket Club in the short term; however, if the council can identify a more suitable site for the club in the long term, it will work with the club to relocate it.
