Question on Notice No. 353 Asked on 8 May 2014

MR BYRNE asked the Premier (MR NEWMAN)—

With reference to Question on Notice No. 649 of 2013 regarding the \$70,683.78 (excluding GST) paid for travel and accommodation expenses during the Keelty Report into Police Community Safety—

Will the Premier (a) advise if any of this money was used to pay for Mr Keelty's travel from his home interstate and for accommodation in Brisbane, and if so, provide a detailed list of the costs, including class of air travel and (b) list all the periods (start and finish date) of employment and various roles (including consultancies, reviews, employment) that Mr Keelty has undertaken for the Queensland Government since 2012?

ANSWER:

(a) Yes, some of this money was used for those purposes, and the costs are outlined in the table below. Under the terms of the contract between the State of Queensland (acting through the Department of the Premier and Cabinet) and Sumic Consulting for the services of Mr Keelty, the Government agreed to reimburse the contractor for all reasonable travel and accommodation expenses.
