Mrs Scott asked the Minister for Education, Training and Employment (Mr Langbroek) –

QUESTION:

With reference to the projected growth in population in Queensland in the coming years and the need for increased staffing to maintain services—

Will the Minister provide details of the projected number of teachers and teacher aides (FTE and head count) to be employed by the department in the current financial year and for 2014-15, 2015-16 and 2016-17 (with each region listed separately for each year)?

ANSWER:

I thank the Member for her question. I have been advised by my Department that:

- To inform its planning processes, the Department undertakes regular analysis of workforce demand based on demographic data sourced from the Office of Economic and Statistical Research.
- Queensland State School and State Secondary School teacher and teacher aide forecasts are determined on a calendar year basis, as opposed to financial year, to align with the school year.
- Teacher projections are expressed as full-time equivalents and teacher aide projections are expressed as hours per week. These are the usual Human Resource units of measurement associated with these position types.
- Current modelling showing projected demand of teachers and teacher aides for each region is listed in the table below:
