## Question on Notice No. 737 Asked on 15 September 2015

MR COSTIGAN ASKED THE MINISTER FOR POLICE, FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES AND MINISTER FOR CORRECTIVE SERVICES (HON J MILLER)—

## QUESTION:

Will the Minister detail, for the Airlie Beach CBD Safe Night Precinct, the number of (a) move on directions given, (b) drug seizures, (c) urinating in public, (d) public nuisance, (e) common assault, (f) assault occasioning bodily harm, (g) total assaults, (h) total offences, (i) resist arrest/incite/hinder/obstruct police officer, (j) number of offenders, (k) disobey move on direction, and (l) offences against public, for the periods 1 October 2013 to 1 September 2014, and 1 October 2014 to 1 September 2015?

## ANSWER:

The Palaszczuk Government remains committed to keeping Queenslanders safe.

The Queensland Police Service (QPS) generally provides statistics based on Police Districts and Regions rather than Safe Night Precincts.

The QPS advises caution in the use of data collected for geographical regions other than the whole of the state, Police Districts and Police Regions, as they are subject to inconsistency.

As the Member for Whitsunday would be aware, the Airlie Beach CBD Safe Night Precinct is located in the QPS Mackay District.

The latest crime statistics for the Mackay District can be found in the Annual Statistical Review at <a href="https://www.police.qld.gov.au">www.police.qld.gov.au</a>.

The Annual Statistical Review is being published for the first time since 2012, when this practice ceased under the former LNP government.
