## Question on Notice No. 894 Asked on Thursday 17 September 2015

MR RUSSO ASKED THE MINISTER FOR HOUSING AND PUBLIC WORKS AND MINISTER FOR SCIENCE AND INNOVATION (HON L ENOCH) -

Will the Minister advise how much funding the Palaszczuk Government is investing in housing and homelessness in my electorate of Sunnybank?

## **ANSWER**

The Palaszczuk Government is committed to the provision of housing and homelessness services in Queensland. This government understands that housing is an important foundation for a person to achieve other vital outcomes such as quality health and education, and strong employment opportunities.

In 2015-16, the Department of Housing and Public Works is providing Housing and Homelessness services statewide through a number of measures, which includes:

- \$394.5 million in capital funding for social housing including:
  - o new construction
  - o purchase of existing homes and land
  - property upgrades (includes major refurbishment activities of a capital nature to kitchens, bathrooms, laundries and new fencing; disability modifications for people with specific needs; and installation of new products to improve amenity and security such as insulation to ceilings and walls and security screening).
- \$245.7 million in maintenance for social housing including:
  - responsive repairs to rectify breakdown of components and incidental damage resulting from storm, flood, cyclone and fire or termite damage
  - planned maintenance, inclusive of cyclical statutory and mandatory services, internal and external painting and replacement of "like for like" property elements such as floor coverings and fencing, where already existing.
  - o property maintenance to restore vacant dwellings for new tenants.
- \$265.3 million in Housing and Homelessness services, for example:
  - accommodation and support to people experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness (Specialist Homelessness Services)
  - support eligible people to remain living in their home by providing critical home maintenance and addressing safety issues (Home Assist Secure)
  - provision of transitional housing to eligible social housing applicants (Community Rent Scheme)
  - private market assistance including bond loans, RentConnect and National Rental Affordability Scheme.

In the electorate of Sunnybank, the Department of Housing and Public Works is investing approximately \$7.9 million in Housing and Homelessness, which includes:

- \$4.9 million in Capital Works for the completion of two social housing projects totalling 20 units of accommodation
- \$728,612 in Capital Works upgrades
- \$2.3 million in maintenance for social housing

In August 2014, the department entered into a funding agreement with Churches of Christ Care that provides a \$10.12M capital grant to deliver 40 units of accommodation in the suburb of Acacia Ridge under the Long-Term Housing program. Construction is planned to commence in November 2015.
