MR KNUTH asked the Minister for Health and Minister for Ambulance Services (HON C R DICK)—

With reference to the Emergency Management Queensland (EMQ) rescue helicopter service, relied upon by people living in rural and remote communities like Dalrymple and Mount Isa -

Will the Minister confirm whether Queensland Health utilises the EMQ rescue helicopter on a pay for service basis, and if so, how is the government ensuring patient safety is not being compromised by budget constraints?
