With reference to the Minister's answer to Question on Notice No. 2109-Will the Minister advise how many jobs have been directly created by the Palaszczuk Government's Advance Queensland program, and provide a breakdown of the 748 jobs that the Advance Queensland program is supporting?

As at 30 September 2016, funding committed in Advance Queensland programs had been identified as directly supporting at least 748 new Queensland jobs.
