**MR T WATTS** ASKED MINISTER FOR POLICE AND MINISTER FOR CORRECTIVE SERVICES (HON M RYAN)—

QUESTION:

Will the Minister advise how many cases relating to reports of sexual assault and reports of domestic violence have led to a referral to the police ethical standards command?

ANSWER:

I am advised by the Queensland Police Service that there were 43 domestic violence complaints and 29 sexual assault complaints received by Ethical Standards Command in 2017-18, where Police Officers or staff members are recorded as subject persons.

The Palaszczuk Government expects the highest standards to be met and maintained by Queensland's police personnel. Any allegation of domestic violence or sexual assault is taken very seriously and fully investigated by the Queensland Police Service. Disciplinary action is taken whenever it is found that the required standards of police personnel have not been met.
