Dear Mr Speaker,

Thank you for your letter of 1 November 2018 regarding Mr Jarrod Bleijie MP, Member for Kawana's concern about the lack of reference to Ministerial Staff headcounts in my answer to Question on Notice 1157.

I take seriously the management and accountability measures around Ministerial staffing. I have asked my office to review the matters raised by you and I am advised the following:

- No specific report focusing on staff headcounts in Ministerial Offices is normally produced;
- The reason for the above is that Ministerial Offices are allocated a budget based on Full Time Equivalents (FTEs) – which is the most reliable accountability and human resource management tool;
- This is not unusual as even the Public Sector Commission quarterly reports focus on FTEs as the most appropriate measure;
- For example, a Minister's Office may be allocated 10 FTEs but may choose to have eight fulltime employees and four half-time employees with a total FTE of 10, consistent with budget accountability, yet a headcount of 12 – which could be open to be misinterpreted;
- Headcounts are virtually irrelevant when it comes to the proper accountability of staff allocations and budget discipline and accountability.

For all the reasons listed above, I submit that reporting on headcounts is not relevant or appropriate for proper government accountability.

Notwithstanding the above, I provide the information as requested and refer to the attached table.
