**MRS S WILSON** ASKED MINISTER FOR POLICE AND MINISTER FOR CORRECTIVE SERVICES (HON M RYAN)—

QUESTION:

With reference to the prevalence of domestic and family violence in the Pumicestone Electorate—

Will the Minister advise the number, since January 2017, of (a) domestic and family violence related incidents reported to police and (b) domestic and family violence related orders made?

ANSWER:

The Queensland Police Service (QPS) has advised that, since January 2017, 1,126 domestic and family violence related incidents were reported to police in the Pumicestone Electorate.

I am advised that the Minister for Justice and Attorney General is best placed to address the number of domestic and family violence report orders made.

The Palaszczuk Government is working hard to protect people from acts of domestic and family violence by investing almost \$200 million over five years on more services, shelters and specialist domestic and family violence courts.

Queenslanders today have more confidence to report crimes of domestic and family violence. There are more police officers on the frontline, targeted police campaigns and better access to new and improved technology.
