**MRS J STUCKEY** ASKED THE MINISTER FOR INNOVATION AND TOURISM INDUSTRY DEVELOPMENT AND MINISTER FOR THE COMMONWEALTH GAMES (HON K JONES) —

QUESTION:

With reference to the Minister's comments at the Greater Southern Gold Coast Chamber of Commerce breakfast meeting on 15 March 2018 as to what additional Commonwealth Games legacy items could be secured for Currumbin schools and sporting clubs in light of the disruption caused by the Games —

Will the Minister advise (a) when legacy sporting equipment or items will be ready to be distributed to community groups and schools, (b) what equipment or items (reported separately by school or group) will be allocated to schools and local community organisations in Currumbin and (c) will the local member be invited to be part of the announcements and presentations?

ANSWER:

The Premier announced the Embracing 2018 Sports Assets Legacy Program on 21 May 2018: <http://statements.qld.gov.au/Statement/2018/5/21/commonwealth-games-assets-gifted-to-queensland-communities>

Distribution of sports assets is currently underway and will be completed over coming weeks.

The program was significantly oversubscribed, with demand for assets far outstripping the volume of items available. Currumbin Special School was offered a number of items through this program but the school declined the offer.

Elanora State High School will receive one of 50 long jump run-ups, repurposed from the Carrara Stadium Athletics Track.
