MRS S WILSON ASKED MINISTER FOR TRANSPORT AND MAIN ROADS (HON M BAILEY)

QUESTION:

With reference to the Premier's reply to Question on Notice No. 232—

Will the Minister outline, in detail, each of the road upgrades being delivered in 2017-18, totalling \$30m, within the Pumicestone Electorate, including (a) the location and cost of each upgrade, (b) timeframes for completion of each upgrade and (c) how each upgrade was assessed for priority?

ANSWER:

I thank the Member for Pumicestone for the question.

The Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) is delivering approximately \$30 million worth of infrastructure to benefit the Pumicestone electorate to improve efficiency and safety. TMR prioritises all upgrades to ensure funding is allocated to those works identified as being needed the most. When deciding where funding is spent, criteria such as traffic volumes, road geometry, the condition of the road and the crash record are all considered.

TMR also undertakes routine maintenance and minor operational safety works as required.

The key upgrades in the 2017–18 financial year for the Pumicestone electorate are listed in the table below. (Please note that some of these projects also cross multiple electorates.)
