**MR J LISTER ASKED MINISTER FOR TRANSPORT AND MAIN ROADS (HON M BAILEY)**

**QUESTION:**

Will the Minister advise the government's plans for the two vacant blocks of land adjacent to the Mango Hill railway station, one of which is currently being used by commuters due to the overflow from the existing car park?

**ANSWER:**

I thank the Member for Southern Downs for the question.

The Department of Transport and Main Roads owns three parcels of land totalling approximately 3.8 hectares on the corner of Halpine Drive and Mango Hill Boulevard, adjacent to Mango Hill rail station.

The Palaszczuk Government is committed to a mixed-use, transit-oriented development (TOD) outcome and improved commuter park 'n' ride facilities on this land.

TOD outcomes serve to provide a number of government and broader community benefits, including increased active transport and public transport patronage, decreased car dependency, efficient use of transport infrastructure, improved rail safety, security and accessibility.

The Redcliffe Peninsula Line delivered six new stations and a total of 2850 new car parks to accommodate commuters.

The Palaszczuk Government is also committed to providing an integrated and efficient public transport network and improving park 'n' ride facilities across the network. The Government has announced \$114 million for park 'n' ride upgrades, boosting the number of spaces across the South East Queensland network by around 2300 spaces.
