MR D PURDIE ASKED MINISTER FOR TRANSPORT AND MAIN ROADS (HON M BAILEY)

QUESTION:

Will the Minister (a) advise the total cost to supply cab vouchers to Queensland Rail (QR) employees in the past financial year (reported separately by region) and (b) confirm whether QR staff are using taxis to travel between Brisbane and other locations including Gympie, Caboolture and the Sunshine Coast?

ANSWER:

I thank the Member for Ninderry for the question.

Queensland Rail is focused on reducing the cost of taxis for staff, and has reduced costs during the last financial year. Queensland Rail continues to investigate ways to further reduce its reliance on taxis while ensuring services are reliable for customers.

For the 2017–18 financial year, Queensland Rail turned over approximately \$2.0 billion and taxi costs comprised 0.086% of consumable expenses.

The total cost of providing taxis to Queensland Rail employees during the past financial year is detailed in the table below.
