MR S BENNETT ASKED MINISTER FOR POLICE AND MINISTER FOR CORRECTIVE SERVICES (HON M RYAN)—

QUESTION:

With reference to the government's one percent reprioritisation – Will the Minister advise which grants, subsidies, supplies and services will be reduced in 2018-19 (listed separately by item)?

ANSWER:

The Government's 2017 election commitments will build on key policy priorities such as strengthening economic growth, particularly in the regions, providing jobs and building better communities.

The previous LNP Government introduced efficiency dividends with the aim of cutting expenditure which meant cuts to front-line services. In contrast the reprioritisation program is about redirecting existing funding to deliver our election commitments to restore front-line services and deliver new public infrastructure. Delivery of this measure will not be at the cost of public service jobs nor the sale of strategic income earning assets.

The reprioritisation of funds is being achieved through actions such as reviewing procurement opportunities, realigning agency expenditure with government priorities, and identifying savings through efficiencies in current programs and activities.

I am advised that the Queensland Police Service budget strategy to achieve the reprioritisation will be shared across each discrete region and command, as well as centrally.
