**MRS J STUCKEY** ASKED MINISTER FOR POLICE AND MINISTER FOR CORRECTIVE SERVICES (HON M RYAN)—

QUESTION:

Will the Minister advise how many Queensland Police Service (QPS) officers from the Palm Beach and Coolangatta QPS stations were seconded to the Commonwealth Games, without replacement to the staff establishment at the station (reported separately by (a) station, (b) number of officers and (c) period of secondment)?

ANSWER:

In response to the Member's question, the Queensland Police Service (QPS) has provided the following information:

**Coolangatta Police Station**

One Sergeant from 9 March 2018 to 16 April 2018.

**Palm Beach Police Station**

Four police officers, including: three Constable/Senior Constable positions:

Officer 1	31 March to 14 April 2018
Officer 2	5 April to 14 April 2018
Officer 3	9 April to 14 April 2018
Officer 4	23 March to 18 April 2018

I am advised by QPS that up to 3,700 police personnel were deployed to ensure that the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games were the safest Games ever. All members of the Queensland Police Service played an important role in helping to achieve a safe and successful Games.

During my many visits to police stations on the Gold Coast during the Games, it was a privilege to see the professional and dedication of our police officers on active patrol. The Queensland Police Service has done a phenomenal job and we thank all officers that worked tirelessly over this time.

Further, I have been advised that the Gold Coast Police District continued to be supported by personnel from other district, regional and centralised support functions including Road Policing, Scenes of Crime, Intelligence, Water Police and Dog Squad.
