**MR A POWELL** ASKED THE MINISTER FOR ENVIRONMENT AND THE GREAT BARRIER REEF, MINISTER FOR SCIENCE AND MINISTER FOR THE ARTS (HON L ENOCH)—

QUESTION:

With reference to the property purchased by the former Department of Environment and Heritage Protection at 60 Bretons Road, Crohamhurst (Lot 1 and 2 on SP167745, Lot 2 on RP810734 and Lot 2 on RP18180)—

Will the Minister advise (a) the number and species of trees planted since purchase, (b) any non-planting based rehabilitation done on site and (c) the floral and faunal species identified on the site, specifically those that appear on the protected species list?

ANSWER:

I thank the Honourable Member for the question.

Revegetation work on the property at 60 Bretons Road, Crohamhurst has included the planting of 16,360 koala habitat plants comprising 12 different species, and a further strategic planting of 215 plants of various species in riparian sections of the property.

Non-revegetation rehabilitation carried out on-site has included property maintenance and mechanical and chemical weed suppression to encourage natural regeneration of forest vegetation.

Incidental sightings of species recorded at Crohamhurst are available on the Queensland Government's wildlife record management system, 'WildNet' at <https://environment.ehp.qld.gov.au/report-request/species-list/>.

In addition to this list, in November 2016, a specialist survey of frogs was undertaken along the riparian corridor on the property which identified three threatened species of frog.
