**MR D BATT** ASKED THE MINISTER FOR ENVIRONMENT AND THE GREAT BARRIER REEF, MINISTER FOR SCIENCE AND MINISTER FOR THE ARTS (HON L ENOCH)—

QUESTION:

With reference to \$5.7m additional allocation for the Grazing Resilience and Sustainable Solutions program—

Will the Minister detail (a) the total amount of State Government funding for this program over the forward estimates (reported by financial year) and (b) which bodies external to government will receive funding from this program?

ANSWER:

I thank the Honourable Member for the question.

The Grazing Resilience and Sustainable Solutions Program (the Program) will support jobs and services in the beef cattle grazing sector while contributing to improved water quality for local waterways that flow to the Great Barrier Reef lagoon. It will also assist graziers to understand and meet the requirements of the new Reef protection regulations and the associated minimum standards for grazing in catchments that flow into the Great Barrier Reef.

The level of funding (excluding GST) per financial year is as follows:
