MR M CRANDON asked the Minister for Health and Minister for Ambulance Services (HON DR S MILES)—

QUESTION

With reference to the answer to Question on Notice No. 279 asked on 21 March 2018—

Will the Minister advise (a) if all flammable cladding on the Princess Alexandria (PA) Hospital has been removed, (b) whether any other Queensland Health facilities have been impacted and (c) the cost of removing and replacing the cladding on the PA Hospital?

ANSWER

- (a) Works to remove combustible cladding from the Princess Alexandra Hospital main building have been completed.
- (b) A program of works to assess and remediate any cladding which is identified as non-compliant across Queensland Health owned facilities is in progress. Remediation works have been initiated to buildings at the Cairns, Mackay, Nambour, Logan and Gold Coast hospital campuses. Remediation works are of a minor nature and will not impact any clinical services at those hospitals affected.
- (c) The cost of cladding remediation works to the Princess Alexandra Hospital will be established following procurement of the replacement contract.
