MR PURDIE ASKED MINISTER FOR POLICE AND MINISTER FOR CORRECTIVE SERVICES (HON M RYAN)—

QUESTION:

Will the Minister specify how many domestic and family violence co-ordinators are currently active across the state, and where each of these co-ordinators is regularly stationed?

ANSWER:

I am advised by the Queensland Police Service (QPS) that District Domestic and Family Violence Coordinators are stationed across every Police District in Queensland.

These officers provide specialist education and training to operational officers and assist other government and non-government agencies to better address domestic and family violence-related issues.

Further, the Palaszczuk Government remains committed to delivering on an election commitment to provide additional specialist Domestic and Family Violence Coordinators across Queensland during this term of government.

QPS has provided the following table in response to the Member's question, as at 27 March 2019:

BRISBANE REGION	6	1
CENTRAL REGION	7	4
NORTHERN REGION	5	6
SOUTH EASTERN REGION	6	7
SOUTHERN REGION	6	4

In addition, these officers are supported by four officers at Central and District levels of the QPS.
