MR A POWELL ASKED MINISTER FOR EDUCATION AND MINISTER FOR INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS (HON G GRACE)

QUESTION:

With reference to the answer to Question on Notice No. 1443 of 2017 which provided a link to a website that did not report absences for 2016-17 and 2017-18—

Will the Minister advise how many students were reported absent from school for more than five, ten and 20 consecutive school days that were unexplained or unauthorised in 2017-18 and 2018-19 to date (reported by absence length, each education region and year)?

ANSWER:

Table 1 provides a count of students with a period of between six and 10 days, 11 and 20 days, and more than 20 days' consecutive unauthorised or unexplained absence in the financial years 2017–18 and 2018–19 (partial). Absences are based on daily data which is subject to change. An unexplained absence is where no reason has been given for the student absence. An unauthorised absence is where the explanation provided is considered by the principal to not be reasonable.
