QUESTION

With reference to the \$100,000 being spent on a scoping study to 'research the best-practice approach for trialling GPS monitoring or a similar technological solution'— Will the Minister advise the timeline of this study and when the results will be made public?

ANSWER

In 2018-19, \$100,000 was committed under the Commonwealth Women's Safety Package for Queensland to develop a scoping study identifying options, including technologies, to monitor high-risk perpetrators of domestic and family violence. Australia's National Research Organisation for Women's Safety has completed a report titled 'Electronic monitoring in the context of domestic and family violence'. The report is being considered by government and will be released in due course.
