Asked on 11 June 2019**

**Mr S Bennett** asked Premier and Minister for Trade (Hon. A Palaszczuk)—

QUESTION:

Will the Premier outline the number of veterans that have been employed in the last year, reported by (a) department and (b) classification level?

ANSWER:

A total of 241 veterans have gained employment in the Queensland Government under the Veterans' Employment Pathway program in the period 24 July 2018 (when the program was announced) to 30 June 2019. Table 1 sets out the Queensland Government departments and entities in which veterans have been placed.

The classification level / salary level at which the successful applicant is engaged is determined by the employing agency, in line with the appropriate certified agreement.
