**MR S O'CONNOR** ASKED MINISTER FOR EDUCATION AND MINISTER FOR INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS (HON G GRACE)

QUESTION:

With reference to the number and age of the demountable classroom buildings at Arundel State School—

Will the Minister commit funding in the upcoming State Budget to build a new learning centre to replace some of the oldest of these demountables?

ANSWER:

The Department of Education is undertaking master planning for Arundel State School to support the long-term infrastructure needs of the school.

Master plans are strategic documents that provide a visual snapshot of a school's current state and graphically identify how future growth could be accommodated on the school site.

The master planning process for Arundel State School is expected to be finalised in Term 2, 2020.

The concept master plan will guide and inform future infrastructure planning and investment.

Preliminary information from the master planning process has identified an opportunity to replace some of the older prefabricated buildings, subject to State Budget processes.
