MS F SIMPSON ASKED MINISTER FOR POLICE AND MINISTER FOR CORRECTIVE SERVICES (HON M RYAN)—

QUESTION:

With reference to the progressive closure of Sunshine Plaza Police beat since November last year and shopkeeper complaints of increased crime, delays in police responses and lower apprehension rates—

Will the Minister advise the monthly apprehension rates for offenders of crime reported at the Plaza (reported separately for the last two years)?

ANSWER:

I am advised by the Queensland Police Service (QPS) that the number of offenders arrested at the Sunshine Plaza Shopping Centre between 1 January 2018 and 31 January 2020 is detailed in the following table:
