**MR J KRAUSE** ASKED MINISTER FOR EDUCATION AND MINISTER FOR INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS (HON G GRACE)

**QUESTION:**

Will the Minister advise (a) how many financial audits of schools were conducted by the department for the years 2015-16 to 2019-20 (to date) (reported separately by financial year) and (b) of those, how much money had to be repaid for issues uncovered in that audit process (reported by total and by year)?

**ANSWER:**

The Department of Education does not conduct stand-alone financial audits of schools. Audits of schools are conducted by the department using a standard school audit program that reviews/checks a number of school management components, including finance. In addition, since 2018–19, a desktop health check of schools is undertaken, which includes an assessment of schools' financial management.
