# **QUESTION**:

With reference to the Drought Assistance Scheme and the Emergency Water Infrastructure Rebate—Will the Minister advise for 2017-18 to 2019-20 to date (a) how many applications have been received and how many have been rejected (reported separately by financial year) and (b) what were the reasons for rejection (reported separately)?

### **ANSWER:**

The table below identifies the number of Drought Relief Assistance Scheme (DRAS) freight subsidy and Emergency Water Infrastructure Rebate (EWIR) applications received and the number of applications rejected by each financial year.
