MR J KRAUSE ASKED TREASURER AND MINISTER FOR TRADE AND INVESTMENT (HON C DICK)—

QUESTION:

With reference to the Queensland Productivity Commission Annual report for the period ending 1 June 2021—

Will the Treasurer provide a list of the exemptions granted by the Queensland Government for Regulatory Impact Statements?

ANSWER:

Under the Queensland Government Guide to Better Regulation, Cabinet may grant an exemption from requiring a Regulatory Impact Statement in exceptional circumstances such as the need to urgently implement government policy or where consultation may compromise the public interest.

The 15 exemptions reported by agencies to the former Queensland Productivity Commission, for the period 1 July 2020 - 1 June 2021, were:

- 9. Local Government (Councillor Vacancies) Amendment Bill 2020
