MR J KELLY ASKED MINISTER FOR TRANSPORT AND MAIN ROADS (HON M BAILEY)—

QUESTION:

Will the Minister outline any projects aimed at improving road safety for students and families around Loreto College?

ANSWER:

I thank the Member for Greenslopes for the question.

The Palaszczuk Government is committed to road safety, particularly around schools, and proudly supports a range of road safety programs and infrastructure projects across Queensland.

I am pleased to advise that the *Queensland Transport and Roads Investment Program* (QTRIP) 2020–21 to 2023–24 includes a \$204,000 funding commitment to improve pedestrian safety on Lade Street at Loreto College, Coorparoo.

This funding is provided through the Transport Infrastructure Development Scheme (TIDS), an annual \$70 million local government grant administered by the Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR). In 2020–21, TMR is providing more than \$2 million to Brisbane City Council through TIDS.

TMR is also supporting road safety at Loreto College through the Road Safety team, who have provided educational road safety information to the school for its newsletter, and will continue to support the school with any further educational needs.
