#### Asked on 26 October 2021

**MR S ANDREW** ASKED THE MINISTER FOR HEALTH AND AMBULANCE SERVICES (HON Y D'ATH)—

#### QUESTION

With reference to the Mackay Base Hospital—

Will the Minister advise for the period from 1 October 2020 to 1 October 2021 (reported separately by month and hospital department) (a) the total number of patients who have died at the hospital, (b) the cause of death listed on each patient's death certificate and (c) the number of Form 1As sent by the Mackay Base Hospital to the Coroner's Office?

### ANSWER

Considering the obligations relating to confidential information under the *Hospital and Health Boards Act 2011* (QLD) and out of respect for friends and family members of the deceased, I will not be responding to part (b) of the question or providing data split by hospital department.

With reference to part (a), the Register of Births, Deaths and Marriages records the location of death based on information supplied in the Cause of Death Certificate. I am advised that the below table provides all deaths with the location recorded as Mackay Base Hospital for the time period 1 October 2020 to 1 October 2021.

With reference to part (c), Form 1A is used "when a doctor seeks advice for the coroner about whether the death is / is not reportable, or the death is reportable and the doctor seeks the coroner's authority to issue a death certificate because the cause of death is known and no autopsy or investigation appears necessary"

The *Coroners Act 2003,* section 8 (3) (a-h), defines what is considered a reportable death.
