DR A MACMAHON asked the Deputy Premier, Minister for State Development, Infrastructure, Local Government and Planning and Minister Assisting the Premier on Olympics Infrastructure (HON S MILES) –

QUESTION:

With reference to widespread community concern about losing green space at Raymond Park, which is earmarked for an Olympics warm-up track—

Will the Deputy Premier advise what the government's plan is to (a) consult with residents in East Brisbane and (b) protect and expand amenity and access to green space in Woolloongabba and East Brisbane over the next decade?

ANSWER:

The Queensland Government will soon commence detailed planning including stakeholder consultation for existing and planned infrastructure being used for the Brisbane 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games, including the Gabba.

As outlined in the response to the Question on Notice No. 287 and 983, the Palaszczuk Government has committed to make 50 per cent of the Woolloongabba Cross River Rail precinct into open space, to be co-designed with the community.

The commitment for 50 per cent open space will be incorporated into the development scheme for the Woolloongabba Cross River Rail Priority Development Area.
