MR A PERRETT ASKED MINISTER FOR AGRICULTURAL INDUSTRY DEVELOPMENT AND FISHERIES AND MINISTER FOR RURAL COMMUNITIES (HON M FURNER)—

QUESTION:

Will the Minister advise since 2019 how many properties, facilities or assets has the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries identified for sale, listed by (a) location, (b) anticipated sale date and (c) if sold, the sale date and price?

ANSWER:

The Department of Agriculture and Fisheries (DAF) delivers its core business through a diverse mix of research and operational facilities located throughout rural and regional Queensland and in doing so it continually reviews its facilities with the aim of maintaining a world-class infrastructure base so that is relevant to industry.

DAF undertakes the disposal and purchases of assets including heavy plant, land and facilities as part of its ordinary course of business. The most common methods of disposal are via auction and trade-in.

There are many steps that DAF must go through prior to disposing of properties which are deemed surplus to departmental requirements. Impediments can include tidal incursion, chemical or noxious weed contamination issues and zoning issues.

The department is funded for the upgrades, replacement and new asset acquisitions through a range of capital programs including research facilities development, minor works, heavy plant and equipment, scientific equipment, vessels and marine equipment and computer equipment programs. These programs are in addition to individual large purchases of properties and/or infrastructure which occur for operational needs and research outcomes, as required.

Some of these locations were surplus to requirements for a number of years prior to disposal.
