MR S O'CONNOR ASKED MINISTER FOR EDUCATION, MINISTER FOR INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS AND MINISTER FOR RACING (HON G GRACE)

## QUESTION:

With reference to Coombabah State High School, Southport State High School, Musgrave Hill State School, Labrador State School, Arundel State School, Biggera Waters State School and Southport Special School—

Will the Minister provide for each school (a) an infrastructure briefing including such metrics as the current built capacity, the number of classrooms, and the years these key pieces of infrastructure were built and (b) any plans, and details of such plans, to upgrade their facilities?

## ANSWER:

The Department of Education is committed to providing fit-for-purpose infrastructure in Queensland's state schools to support learning outcomes, as well as maximising the utilisation of its educational infrastructure.

During the 2020 State Election, the Palaszczuk Government committed to upgrading facilities across Queensland, including:

- \$300,000 to upgrade the amenities at Arundel State School;
- \$150,000 to build a shade cover over the playground and install industrial-sized fans in the school hall at Labrador State School;
- \$700,000 for a security fence at Coombabah State High School; and
- \$1 million to improve the entrance and bus and taxi set-down at Southport Special School.

In 2021–22, additional funding has been allocated to schools, including:

- \$14.1 million for additional classrooms at Coombabah State High School;
- \$500,000 to upgrade the hall at Labrador State School; and
- \$500,000 for a new canteen at Southport State High School.

The following table provides the requested data for the seven schools, as at June 2021.

When considering new infrastructure projects for school facilities, the department works with principals to develop a list of priorities through a School Strategic Infrastructure Plan (SSIP). The SSIP is the department's primary method for identifying important facility needs for each Queensland state school.

SSIP proposals are submitted for consideration and assessed through a prioritisation process to ensure the highest needs across the State are met. This process is used to develop the department's short, medium and long-term investment outlooks, subject to the department's allocated budget.
