MR S O'CONNOR asked the Deputy Premier and Minister for State Development, Infrastructure, Local Government and Planning (HON S MILES) –

QUESTION:

With reference to the Resource Recovery Industry development program which is due to expire in September 2021—

Will the Deputy Premier detail (a) how many applicants have applied to each stream (broken down by the stream and the amount of funding requested) and (b) what plans the government has for the over \$60m they have failed to allocate?

ANSWER:

(a) The Resource Recovery Industry Development Program (RRIDP) has provided funding to Queensland's resource recovery industries through support for projects and initiatives that divert waste from landfill, reduce stockpiling and create jobs.

RRIDP Applications:

(b) The remaining funds are allocated to further projects currently being negotiated or not yet announced, and to government priorities including the newly established Queensland Recycling Modernisation Fund (QRMF).
