MRS L GERBER asked the Minister for Children and Youth Justice and Minister for Multicultural Affairs (HON L LINARD)—

QUESTION

With reference to youth justice and youth offenders on the Gold Coast—

Will the Minister advise from 2017 to 2022 (reported separately by month) (a) the total number of youth offenders and (b) how many youth offenders reoffended whilst on bail?

ANSWER

The Palaszczuk Government is committed to reducing offending and reoffending and keeping the community safe.

Across Queensland, the number of young people who offend has been decreasing over time. The number of young people with a proven offence decreased 13 per cent in 2021-22 compared to 2020-21, and 28 per cent compared to 2018-19.

For the Gold Coast Local Government Area (LGA), the number of young people with a proven offence has decreased by 17 per cent since 2020-21 and 8 per cent since 2018-19.

This demonstrates the programs, services and interventions designed to intervene early, identify the underlying causes of offending and address those issues, are having an impact.

The Department of Children, Youth Justice and Multicultural Affairs, Queensland Police Service and Queensland courts all play a significant role in addressing youth crime and assisting young people across Queensland.

(a) The table below provides the total number of young people who have committed offences within the Gold Coast LGA, from January 2017 to June 2022. Young people are counted in a given month, based on the date the offence was finalised in court. Young people are only counted once per month, but can be counted in multiple months.
